

宿迁简介&地图 of SUQIAN

Suqian in northern Jiangsu is a newcomer that newly proclaimed its city status since year 1996. For those who are interested in history of the Chu-Han Contention, the Hometown of the Hegemon-King is a must-visit attraction.

The official residence of Qianlong Emperor in Suqian was named a UNESCO World Heritage Site in year 2014. The Qianlong Emperor of the Qing dynasty had stayed in the temporary residence for five times during his six inspection tours to Jiangnan.

Yanghe town and Shuanggou town in Suqian are two famous wine production areas.


Cultural History 历史文化

Hometown of the Hegemon-King

Suqian is the birthplace of Xiang Yu, the hegemon-king of Western Chu. The people here pay respect to him by erecting a monument and a memorial arch at Wutong Lane in Xiaxiang district. The district also features a Xiang Yu thematic 4D cineplex, a replica of Xiang Residence, administrative centre, Xiang Clan Temple and etc. On certain days, if you reach before 9am at the main gate of the thematic park, you get to witness the ceremony of opening the old city gate, accompanied by various other cultural performances.

Official Residence of Qianlong Emperor in Suqian

Qianlong Emperor visited the southern part of China for six times and five of which he made this place his temporary residence. He even erected a pavilion and a monument here. The buildings here include a group of Chinese traditional residence, royal pavilion, drum and bell tower, as well as the east and west wings of courtyard-centric rooms. Since year 2014, this significant heritage along Beijing - Hangzhou Grand Canal has been enlisted as UNESCO World Heritage.

Trending Attractions 潮流热点

■ Santai Mountain National Forest Reserve

Forest coverage achieved 80% and above at this part of the forest reserve, serving the city as a natural oxygen supplier. Santai Mountain is well-known for its sea of blooming flowers. Corn roses, common sage, lavender, orange coneflower, and pear blossom blooming in every season accordingly, dotted the lush forest with vibrant colours.

■ Suqian Crystal - World Glass Art Gallery

Combining science discovery, interactive learning, and cultural experience, this art gallery exposes the journey of sand, bringing visitors to go through the origin of glass, to see how glasses are produced, including the manufacturing processes, and design creativity. Through this fruitful journey of exploration, visitors will learn about Suqian's unique identity as a historic glass manufacturing town.

Winery Culture 美酒文化

■ Shuanggou Winery Cultural Tourism Zone

Shuanggou Winery is the one and only winery built beside a wetland, well-acclaimed as one of the three famous wetland wineries, on par with French Brandy's origin and Scottish Whisky's origin. There are a few attractions within the site, including wine tasting area, underground sea of wine and etc.

■ Yanghe Winery Cultural Tourism Zone

Yanghe is the origin town of Chinese rice wine. The blue series under the trademark of Yanghe has been a popular classic long-lasting in the rice wine market, featuring Ocean Blue, Sky Blue, and Dreamy Blue. Yanghe Winery is an integrated cultural tourism zone that exhibits cultural display, science education, and leisure shopping.

Food & Beverage 饮食文化

Suqian dishes are generally salty and regularly seafood, accompanied by rice. Food is either sautéed, boiled, or fried. VISA

Singaporean passport holders enjoy 15-day stay in China without visa, whereas Malaysian passport holders will have to apply for tourist visa.



Flights

Singapore/Kuala Lumpur --->Suqian:

There is no direct flight to Suqian. You will have to take flight from Singapore to Xuzhou, from which you can take a train or bus to Suqian.



Voltage

Voltage power is 220V, 50Hz. Recommended to bring along plug convertor.

Weather Condition

Seasons Suitable for Tourists Sightseeing:

The average temperature in spring (April to May) and autumn (mid-September to mid-November) is 14.9°C and 16.4°C respectively.

Other Seasons:

Summer (June to mid-September) more humid than Singapore and Malaysia, accompanied with raining season; Winter (mid-November to end of March) with average temperature around 3.0°C, please keep warm.

Time Difference

Singapore and Malaysia are within the same time zone (GMT+8) with China.
